

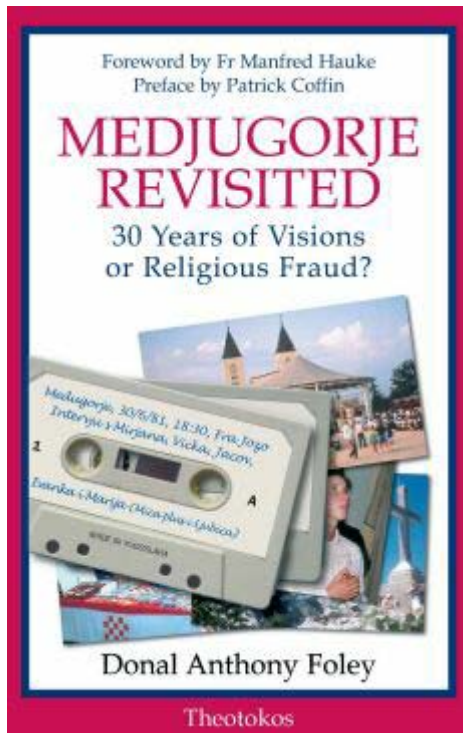

Medjugorje Revisited: 30 Years of Visions or Religious Fraud? investigates the alleged visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Medjugorje, looking at their origins, and their impact on the Catholic Church. It is an expanded, revised and updated version of *Understanding Medjugorje*, which was published in 2006.

Since then there have been important new developments, including the formation of an International Commission to investigate the alleged visions.

Millions of people have visited Medjugorje, even though it has received no official Church approval. If you want to know the truth about Medjugorje, then *Medjugorje Revisited* will give you the whole story, right from the beginning.

With a Foreword by Marian scholar Fr Manfred Hauke, and a Preface by author and radio host Patrick Coffin, *Medjugorje Revisited* focuses on the transcripts of the original tapes of the visionaries made in June 1981, as well as the credibility of the visions and the visionaries, demonstrating the serious problems involved in accepting Medjugorje as genuine.

It also examines the role of theologians, and the Hercegovina Franciscans, in promoting Medjugorje, and its tangled historical and religious background, as well as its links with the Charismatic Renewal. In sum, it examines all the relevant evidence about Medjugorje, and concludes that, despite some "good fruits," it bears all the hallmarks of a vast religious fraud.

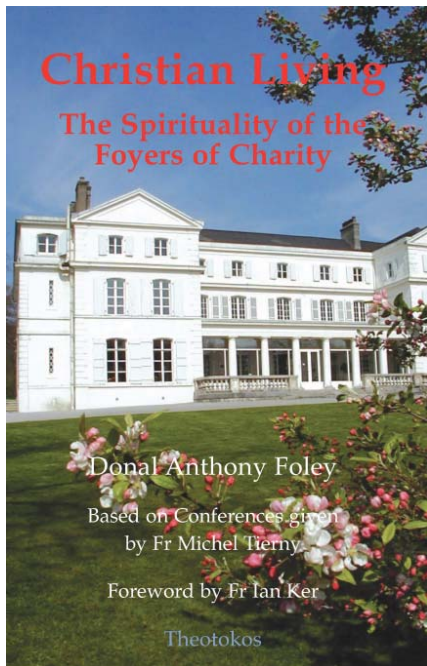

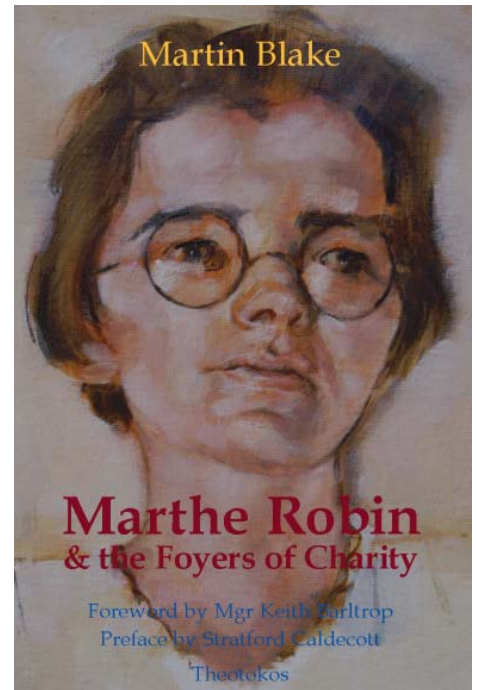

Marthe Robin and the Foyers of Charity looks at the life of Marthe Robin, the French mystic, who, with Fr Georges Finet, co-founded the Foyer of Charity community at Châteauneuf-de-Galaure in southeastern France in 1936. There are now 75 Foyer communities throughout the world, and their work involves a priest, the Father of the Foyer, giving 5 day retreats in silence, during which the members of the community look after the needs of the retreatants and pray for them.
