All the Popes from Pius XII onwards have approved the message because, as Blessed John Paul II said in his homily at Fatima on 13 May 1982, its "basic content is the truth and call of the Gospel itself: 'repent and believe in the Gospel' (Mk 1:15)".

The World Apostolate is self-governing in each country, and always operates only with the approval of the Bishops' Conference or the local Ordinary, and subject to the permission of the parish priest.

In England, the World Apostolate of Fatima began in 1981, and was recognised by the Bishops' Conference in 1982. In May 2002, Archbishop Vincent Nichols of Birmingham commended the WAF, and it was formally approved by the Bishops' Conference in 2004.
